Arts – Literature	The Red Wheelbarrow is about Williams’ emotional state at a particular time	Is it possible to develop <i>objective</i> answers in relation to the critique of art?
Languages	Bullfighting is crucial to Spanish identity	Does belonging to a particular culture mean that you are tied to a particular <i>perspective</i> on the world?
History	The Second World War was caused by the economic situation in Germany at the time	What makes better and worse <i>interpretations</i> in history?
